Charleston Southern University (CSU) accepts transfer credit from other institutions of higher education based on the

(2) the comparability of the nature, content, and level of the learning experience to that offered and CSU;

(3) the appropriateness and applicability of the learning experience to the programs offered by CSU, in light of the student's educational goals (i.e. choice of de**preg**ram).

The first of the above considerations primarily deals with accreditation. CSU will accept transfer credit issued by institutions academically accredited through the Southern, Western, Northwest, New England, North Central, or Middle CSUseeksto reviewthetransferrincollege's academicstandard at the institutional level and

ransfer courses which are constructed or delivered in manners outside generally held best a, academic administrators, to include chairs and deans, are expected to exercise appropriate demic credit for transfer. > The second and third of the above considerations deal with comparability and applicability of the transfer credit. Generally, this information is obtained from catalogs and course related materials. The Transfer Credit Evaluator(TCE) in the CSU Office of the Registrar determines the appropriate method of evaluating and awarding credit. For undergraduate credit, the TCE reviews transcripts to determine if an articulation agreement already exists. The TCE performs course by course evaluations and awardst **(opedic)** omparable courses from all eligible institutions. If course titles and/or descriptions are questionable, the TCE sends the information to the appropriate department chairperson for an evaluation decision. Some departments, such as Education, Music and Nursing routinely review credit to determine appropriateness for their degree programs. Typically, courses in diploma/certificate programs or vocationally focused degree programs are not eligible for transfer. IV. Graduate programs set their own rules for accepted transfer credit hours allowed as noted under each program in the CSU Graduate Catalog. However, note that in no circumstance may that program accept more than 66% of the credit hour required for that program; in all cases more than one third (defined here as 34%) of credit hours must be earned in the Charleston Southern program.
